Margaret Saunders' Meanderings

From my house I can see the hills opposite, on the eastern side of the valley and I like to look at them at different times of the day and in different lights. Today, I have decided to walk up to the top of that side of the valley, where grey clouds are hovering with a hint of menace. However, the rest of the sky is blue with a scattering of white clouds.

Taking footpaths down into the village I cross the main road into North Lyminge past dwellings old and new and for a few yards I walk alongside the Nailbourne, now in its Summer mode of slow movement, which at this point is only visible by light flickering on the surface through the trees. A little further along the gradient must be slightly steeper as it begins to tumble and at one point, even to gurgle.

I turn right onto the Bridle Path where deep shadow has cooled the air. Sunk between two banks the path climbs gently but steadily. Spikes of cuckoo-pint, or lords-and-ladies, push up, their brilliant red berries in stark contrast to the deep greens which surround them. Passing through the gate I am now on a narrow footpath with partial shade from my right and open fields full of sheep to my left. Blackberry bushes are still in flower on this north facing path and I wonder if they will ever come to fruit this late in the season. A few thistles are growing from the base of the wire fence and the pale pink and white flowers of bindweed cover the ground on my right, but apart from these flowers, no others are visible. Summer is moving on and flowers are becoming scarce. There is no breeze here as the path is in the lea of the westerly wind.

Ahead of me is a gate leading into a wide, open field populated by sheep and I know this is one of the fields I can



see from my house. A faint track shows me which direction to take. Silence is all around me except for the sound of my feet brushing through the crisp dry grass. Grateful for the stronger cooling breeze I am now in full sunshine and the early afternoon heat is surprisingly intense. Pylons stride across the fields, tall and strong. I turn to look back at 'my' side of the valley. How different it looks with houses here and there along the valley road, smaller fields and plenty of trees. This eastern side is more open, more remote and has little known

treasures – small valleys hidden from view that only become apparent when the land is walked. The silence is intense and beautiful. A buzzard circles overhead, black against the sky.

Adjacent to the next gate a notice warns me that I am entering MOD land which is used as army training ground. I am to keep to the path and not touch any suspicious objects. From here onwards the path becomes steeper as it climbs towards the top of the valley. At one side of the path, brambles grow tall and plentiful and wild marjoram has tucked itself into the base of this jumble,





attracting meadow brown butterflies, easy to identify as they fold their wings when they land. I rub some of the leaves between finger and thumb and inhale the pungency of the herb. Behind is a steep bank covered with trees, some of which at the edge grow out at right angles. Hawes on hawthorn trees are ripening to orange as nature prepares itself

for Autumn and Winter. It is very dark in amongst these trees but I can see patches of earth in places which have had army boots sliding down the banks as the soldiers,

some of them Ukrainian or Gurkhas from Nepal, train for active service. As the grass path turns into a gravelled track, there is open sky ahead of me and it is not long before I am at the top of the valley at Shuttlesfield Farm. Here the land flattens for some distance and fields are smaller than those behind me. Farm machinery is all around, some well camouflaged by clumps of thistles from which feather-like thistledown emerges, gathering speed as they enter the drift of the wind. Further along, round hay bales from a previous



harvest are home to outcrops of rosebay-willowherb, a flower I always associate with the fading days of Summer. Sheep scatter ahead of me on the bridle path, leaving their resting places amongst the shade of small scrubby trees. It feels like another world up here. The farm is at the end of a track which leads no further and sheep are everywhere but at times it will sound like a battlefield when the army is on manoeuvres.

The grey clouds that I had previously seen hanging over this area have disappeared and the sky is now full of interesting cloud shapes. I will look at the hills with different eyes, as I can now picture the contours that lie behind the view.

District Councillors' Update - October 2024

Waste collection service – there have been some issues with collection of waste from several properties in the North Downs West Ward. These seem to have been resolved but if anyone does have a problem with waste collection please do let me know.

Folkestone Sports Centre – this is now in the hands of the Administrators. Local residents are anxiously awaiting further details, particularly in relation to the swimming pool and ski centre.



Annual Canvass – FHDC has just started the annual canvass, a statutory requirement, to ensure the

electoral register is up-to-date. Residents will either receive an email about this or – if the council does not have your email address – a paper form through your letterbox. Households should read the instructions carefully as there may not be a need to respond. More information about the process can be found on the council's website.

My Community Voice – (Kent Police Local Policing team) Book your Fraud Protect Presentation - The Fraud Prevent and Protect Officer is keen to give presentations to organisations and community groups on how to protect yourselves from the threat of scams and avoid criminals stealing your money. These can be tapered for the needs and requirements of any group and can be booked for anytime in the future. If you are part of or in charge of any groups, including businesses that would benefit from this input, then please contact Stephen Kelly at <u>Stephen.kelly@kent.police.uk</u> **Ticket Fraud** Many of you may have been unsuccessful in obtaining tickets for next year's Oasis concerts. It is important now if you are looking on-line for tickets being sold second hand that you do not end up "looking back in anger" from buying fake Oasis tickets. Criminals will see this as a wonderful opportunity to advertise fake tickets for sale via social media etc. Be vigilant, avoid clicking on suspicious links and only ever use authorised ticket agents to buy tickets. F&HDC has launched a new campaign called Raise the Rate which aims to improve the District's current recycling rate of 44.6% by encouraging residents to be extra careful about putting the right things in the correct bins. As part of the campaign an A-Z guide for recycling and waste page has been launched along with details for recycling and waste resources. See F&HDC's website for details

Sibton Meadows is being advertised on a camping website and motorhomes and tents have been seen on it. The Enforcement Officer told me that the use of land for a recreational campsite for not more than 60 days in a year is permitted and therefore it is not in breach of planning control. The District is facilitating both the Autumn Well Event and the Winter Well Event again this year. The Autumn Well Event is being held on the 20th September in Hythe and the Winter Well Event is being held on 27th November in Folkestone. These events are a one stop shop morning providing advice and help from a range of agencies.





Lyminge Speedwatch Group

On Friday 26 July 2024 Lyminge Speedwatch took part in an organised county-wide Action Day.

We arranged four Speedwatch sessions in the Parish: in Lyminge village, Rhodes Minnis and Etchinghill hamlets, each lasting one hour with three or four volunteers at each one.

The combined results show that a total of 481 vehicles passed us (we only record in one direction during the sessions), of which 24 were recorded travelling at 35 mph or higher speeds (5% of all vehicles).

County-wide, more than 300 volunteers took part in the Action Day at 113 locations with 1237 vehicles observed exceeding the local speed limit, all of which are SPEEDWATCH now added to the Speedwatch database. In incidents like this, drivers can receive a letter or a visit from a Police Officer.



We know from conversations

with local residents during all our Speedwatch sessions that many are concerned about the speed of vehicles through our village and hamlets. However, with an average of 5% the figure is low compared to other Speedwatch teams' results. Nevertheless, there is more to be done.

The overall percentage of offenders in 2024 is about the same in Lyminge and Etchinghill with a slightly higher percentage in Rhodes Minnis.





Ultra Processed Main Meal Replacement

Simple quick main meal swaps that can be picked up on the way home but are not heavily processed really need to be researched as it can be very confusing. In Lidl's I noticed several products that looked very similar but scored very differently in terms of healthy ingredients. It is really worth spending some time looking at the boxed store-bought foods you use regularly and finding the best minimally processed version. After looking at so many labels over the last few months, it seems to me that buying ready cooked meals is the same as purchasing Ultra Process Food like substances.

Canned and frozen veggies are easily stored, minimally processed and with, baked potato, rice, couscous, quinoa, eggs, cheese herb, spices and fresh veggies can usually offer easy dinners. Maybe we all need to stop watching cooking programmes and get cooking. Much easier said than done I suspect!

Jobs To Do In The Garden This Month

- You can sow overwintering broad beans in situ. Cover with fleece to protect against frosts
- Sow overwintering varieties of peas such as 'Douce Provence' or 'Meteor'
- Plant out spring cabbages. Remember to net them for protection from pigeons
- Finish planting autumn onion sets for a crop in early to mid-summer next year
- Plant garlic cloves
- Dig up and store your roots crops such as carrots, beetroot and potatoes

Tried And Tested Cooking Hacks

The easiest way to cook beetroot. Pop it into the sink. Top and tail and scrub with a scourer or brush. Place each individual beetroot onto a piece of silver foil large enough to completely cover. Splash on a generous dash of balsamic glaze. Bake in oven at 180°C. The time will depend on the size of beetroot but a fist sized bulb normally takes around 40 to 60 minutes. Insert a knife into the foil and see if it's soft. Serve with whatever you like or use in the traditional way, cold and in a salad.

Sometimes You Just Need Something Sweet!

The bread mix used in the pizza recipe last month is quite versatile. You can use it for loaves, focaccia, rolls as well as sweet things. **Chelsea Buns**

Empty the bread mix into a large bowl.

In a measuring jug, break an egg, vegans can use an egg substitute or soaked flax seed. Make up to the required amount of liquid with some warm milk and a desert spoonful of sugar and a dash of oil. Pour into the bread mix.

Knead together for around 5 minutes in the same bowl (less messy).

Cover bowl and leave to double in size. Knock dough together to distribute air, shouldn't take long. Roll into a rectangle about 1cm thick.

In a small bowl, mix together I egg (or vegan substitute), 1 dessert spoonful of sugar, 1 teaspoon of mixed spice and a handful of dried fruit. Spread this over the dough before rolling up like a sausage roll. Cut across the dough into slices around 3cms thick giving the familiar Chelsea bun shape.

Carefully place the buns side by side on greased baking tray. You should get around 10. Lay them touching each other at the edge. Sprinkle with demerara sugar and leave to rise till double in size again.

Bake at around 200°C for 20 to 30 minutes, then EAT!! (you may want to let them cool a little!!)

Lyminge Parish Neighbourhood Plan - Natural Environment Policies

Hopefully you all know that we are working towards creating a Neighbourhood Plan for the Parish. More details can be found through the Parish Council and their website. As part of the Plan we will be developing various policies related to our natural environment. Currently we expect these policies to cover aspects such as "Biodiversity and wildlife corridors", to map out our green and blue infrastructure and demonstrate how it can be safeguarded, expanded, and better connected, with scope to identify biodiversity opportunity areas;

"Local green spaces", to safeguard demonstrably special green space from inappropriate development; "Significant local views", to identify views that are particularly special and safeguard from the impacts of development; "Dark Skies"; and "Flooding and drainage". We may organise some small group meetings to work on these Natural Environment policies, if you would like to join in please let us know via tony.king@lymingeparishcouncil.org.uk, otherwise keep an eye out for news from the Parish Council about how to get involved in other policy areas or in the Neighbourhood Plan process more generally.

Butterfly Conservation

Big Butterfly Count results: "We're in a Butterfly Emergency". Thanks to everyone who participated in the Big Butterfly Count this year. However the national results illustrate how terrible 2024 was for butterflies in the UK. According to Butterfly Conservation just seven butterflies were spotted on average per 15-minute Count, a drop of almost 50% on last year's average of 12, and the lowest in the 14-year history of the Big Butterfly Count. It was the worst summer in the Count's history for Common Blue, Holly Blue, Green-veined White, Small White, Small Tortoiseshell, Painted Lady and Scotch Argus. And the majority of species (81%) showed declines in the number seen this year compared with 2023. Rare Ruderal Bumblebees Found in Lyminge

In better news for our pollinators, we managed to find two more Ruderal Bumblebees in Lyminge during August. Having found a queen in spring last year, the first time this rare bumblebee had been reported from the Parish, we stepped up our efforts this year to find more. We were rewarded in August with two males found, one on red clover flowers



on Brady Hill, the other on a flowering teasel at the top of Court Lodge Green. Males can be distinguished from the similar Garden Bumblebee by their golden "whiskers" and shorter cropped hair. The thoughtful management of Brady Hill and Court Lodge Green in recent years has probably helped the species locally.

Parish Council Climate Action Meetings

Lyminge Parish Council recently decided to create a Climate Action Committee. What Does Harvest Festival Mean to YOU??

As I set out to write about Harvest this year, I wondered how I could possibly find anything new to say about our familiar, annual thanksgiving and celebration of God's goodness and the productivity of our land.

Good fortune came my way. I have just been in Uganda, helping to train a group of Christian doctors from ten different countries. So, I asked them: 'What does Harvest Festival look like in your churches?'. This was met by silence and blank faces. None of them have harvest festivals in their churches, but this is what they did share with me.

In Nigeria, Anglican churches may have a festival that we might recognise, but the important yam harvest is mostly celebrated by people of traditional religions. In Guinea, on the west coast of Africa, there is no celebration of harvest from the land, but, at a certain time of year, the sea boils with fish, and there is general thanksgiving after this annual event.

In Uganda and the Democratic Republic of Congo, being so close to the equator, there is no rhythm of the seasons as in temperate zones. Various crops such as wheat, maize, and ground nuts are harvested at different times. People

will bring some of their crops to the church to be blessed by the priest and distributed to the poor. It is always the first of the crop, or the best of the crop, that they offer to God in this way.

In Russia, there is no celebration because there is still a total disconnect between the land and the food eaten by people in towns and cities - a legacy from the huge collective farms of Communist times.

The city-dwellers of Australia, have little sense of the fragility of the land, whereas rural people are all too aware of their dependence on a balance of sun and rain, and concerned by the changes happening to the climate.

Most Christians in South Sudan are nomads, moving according to the needs of their cattle. They have no harvest as they do not stay in one place long enough to grow crops.

In Zambia, the harvest of crops - maize, pumpkin, ground nuts - is entirely dependent on the season's rainfall. Last year, the rains lasted only a month and a half instead of the usual five. Entire harvests failed, families lost everything, and hospitals are seeing children with malnutrition. But people still bring to church to give thanks for what they have managed to grow.

In Barbados, the sugar cane harvest celebration is entirely secular, with parties and dancing.

In Tanzania, families bring their harvest- and their livestock – to church on Sunday to be used according to the needs of the church. Chickens and goats are brought into the church, but fortunately the cows remain outside.

Many of these doctors come from countries where living is a daily struggle. Listening to them talk about their faith, and hearing their stories, has been our privilege and has felt like a bountiful harvest.







LYMINGE THEN AND NOW

Our monthly look at how Lyminge has changed over the years, with thanks to Lyminge Historical Society.



Out & About..



After looking at Yew Tree Cross in September, this month we have moved along Brady Road to the junction with Woodland Road and a view in the direction of the hamlet of Woodland. The picture on the left is from a postcard post-dated 1962, although the picture could easily have been taken at any point in the fifty years prior to this date.

The tree in the centre of the picture on the right is an example of the significantly increased tree-cover around the village that exists now compared with even sixty years ago, let alone the half century or more before that. Aside from the tree, the greatest visible change between these views is in the addition of street furniture, even at this peripheral part of the village. A kerb has now been put around the verge, a decorative flower trough has been installed, there is a seat, speed and road width signs, a footpath finger-post, and a litter bin on the fence. Just out of shot is the village sign installed by Kent Highways at the request of the Parish Council only in 2020, the first time so far as we know that this entry point to the village had ever been formally marked.

The hedge along the north side of Woodland Road hides the view to the right in both pictures. In the 19th Century, this was Mill Field, part of Robus Farm (now Old Robus). Building began on this field only between the World Wars with the construction of Valley Farm, Hill View and Pill Rags, (the latter name taken from the field to the left in the middle distance bordering Skeete Road). These were all standing when the picture on the left was taken some time around 1960, although they are hidden from view by the hedge. Two more bungalows were added as infill later, and then two houses at the end of the row in the late 1990s to complete this development extending the envelope of the village that we know today.

Daphne Lilian Andrews (17 March 1946 – 16 August 2024) An outstanding Citizen of Lyminge



Daphne lived in and around Lyminge all her life. She was born at Hawes Farm in Stelling, on the Droveway between Wheelbarrow Town and Elham, which serves as the parish boundary with Lyminge. When she was three, the family moved to Little Rhode Farm in Rhodes Minnis. Here Daphne spent the next thirteen years of her life, attending the old Lyminge Primary School (now the site of Church Court), and later Harcourt Girls' School in Cheriton, helping out on the farm when she was not at school, collecting eggs, delivering the butter her mother made weekly and feeding the animals, amongst many other tasks.

After school, Daphne went to Folkestone Technical College. She learned typing and shorthand, which she used to get jobs first for the Citroen car dealership in Folkestone, then at Godfrey Davis car hire, based at the Peacocks Ford dealership, managing the offices in Folkestone and Dover. Later, she began working part-time at Lyminge Post Office where she became well-known, both for her friendly smile of welcome to customers and for her scrupulous attention to detail. She was unfailingly cheerful, conscientious and efficient.

Daphne continued to live at home in Rhodes Minnis, caring for her mother. After she died, Daphne married the love of her life Ian Andrews, whom she had met at Peacocks, and they had twenty three happy years together in Lyminge until Ian's death in 2017.

Throughout her life, Daphne was an active member of many community organisations. At Rhodes Minnis Methodist Chapel, she was organist, a position she held for sixty years. She also served as treasurer and took on much of the administrative work. The chapel was kept beautifully decorated with flowers, mostly supplied from Daphne's garden.

Daphne was a keen gardener and belonged to not just one Gardeners' Society but two, being active at both Rhodes Minnis and in Lyminge, helping at the regular shows, taking notes and photographing the winners for local press reports, and often winning prizes herself. She was always generous of her time, and her flowers, and had a particular passion for dahlias and lilies.

Daphne was well-known for her attention to detail, a talent that she ably employed proof-reading the monthly Lyminge Newsletter for the Lyminge Association, as well as 'Lyminge a History', the annual publication of the Lyminge Historical Society. Daphne's ability to spot errors of detail as well as typographical mistakes was second to none.

As a member of Lyminge Friends, Daphne was always ready to participate in outings and act as chauffeur for those who needed a lift. She was a member of Etchinghill Women's Institute, and was treasurer of the Rhodes Minnis Monday Club and of the Rhodes Minnis Circle. On the committee for Lyminge Historical Society over many years, she ably managed sales of the society's publications, and was the ever-friendly face who greeted people as they arrived for meetings.

It is no surprise that Daphne was recognised with the Parish Council's Good Citizen Award in 2012, presented by the Deputy Lord Lieutenant of Kent. But perhaps the best tribute of all was the service held at Rhodes Minnis Chapel following her funeral which was standing room only. Daphne would no doubt have found it great fun and we would have been blessed with her famous broad smile. We will all miss her deeply.
