Margaret Saunders' Meanderings

November has drifted into December, and with a cold snap behind us and a run of wet days forecast for the foreseeable future, I take the opportunity of a walk on a day that promises some sunshine and no rain. Deciding on a circular walk, I set off along Woodland Road from the Brady Road crossroads. The drainage pond at the junction with Skeete Road has begun to fill and fallen leaves on the road make it squidgy underfoot. Hedgerows and countryside lack significant colour at this time of year so I look for the more muted colours as I walk between the hedgerows that border the road.



Cherry red dogwood twigs push up straight and tall amongst red wayfarer and bramble, yellow maple and bronze beech leaves. Hazel catkins provide a soft green; ivy a darker green. Hart's tongue fern sprouts from the bank, its glossy green fronds resembling a deer's tongue, hence its name. It is an ancient-woodland-indicator plant and can also be an indication of ecological continuity. Spores are stored on the underside of the leaves in short horizontal stripes leading out from either side of the midrib. I keep to the right hand side of the road where the hedge grows up the steep bank as it is here that I can catch some Winter sun, which still has warmth even though it is only three weeks away from the shortest day. Gaps in the hedge to my left give a view of undulating land up the Skeete Valley – Storm Bert has stripped the trees of their leaves paring them back to their bare bones which stand out on horizons and afford a clearer view of the landscape. Some fields have been ploughed and others planted with wheat, their green shoots lined up in even rows.

An oak tree, with its huge expanse of branches, makes a canopy across the road, the few remaining leaves jiggling and rustling in the breeze. Leafless trees let in more light so in some ways this walk is lighter in Winter than Summer. Pheasants scuttle about amongst the trees behind mesh fencing,

alarmed at my presence, warning each other with their loud croaking call. Trapped the lane-side of the fence is a hen pheasant, which cowers motionless, hoping the danger will pass.

At the top of Woodland Road I take Green Lane to the right. Both these roads are descriptively named, although woodland has been cleared along much of Woodland Road making it more of a 'green' lane and paradoxically Green Lane has more woodland cover to either side. Nature has adorned my route sparingly: ivy clad fence posts, the bright berries of holly, black briony and rosehips, filigree bronze bracken and the Autumnal shades of the last remaining leaves, all with a rich backdrop of green tones from moss, ivy, lichen, holly and evergreens. An apron of tan coloured fungi wraps itself around the base of a dead tree whose trunk is completely

covered in ivy, even extending out along some of its branches. Amongst the thicker twigs of

a tree, an untidy nest has managed to survive the strong winds, maybe good enough for a remake next Spring. To my right are chestnut trees, coppiced years ago, regrown and in one cluster I counted twelve substantial tree trunks thrusting skywards. Around them lay stumps, rotting into interesting shapes that would grace any stumpery. A female pheasant moves amongst a carpet of beech leaves, its mottled black and pale brown plumage providing perfect camouflage. Pheasant cries echo around and through this stretch of woodland against a background of shots being fired at their cousins in the distance. A sudden gust of wind



causes large droplets of water to fall noisily from the overhanging trees. Lying across the woodland floor is a fallen beech tree from a previous year, its roots cleanly severed from the soil and its smooth trunk lifeless for all appearances, but nature will be busy at work on this new food source and home.



Woodland peters out and is replaced by open grassland. Here and there an acorn has grown into an oak tree against the fence, and then subsequently cut back by hedge trimming. Many of the leaves remain in place and quiver in the freshening breeze. Stopping to look more closely at the leaves, which vary in size from quite small to very large, I see a few clusters of oak galls, their smooth brown surface blending with the surrounding leaves.

Dwellings begin to appear and the hedgerows disappear. Fifteen to twenty noisy mallards take fright, splashing into their pond as I pass, creating 'v' shaped wakes across the surface. I eventually turn right at the crossroads and walk along Longage Hill until I reach the gate leading to the narrow fenced footpath which runs parallel to the road. I slip and slide on the uneven muddy surface until I am safely through the gate at the other end. Pig grunts and the clucking of fowl accompany me along the footpath as I head across to skirt Sibton Park and then back up to Brady Road. A chill westerly wind whips down the hills from Skeete and I am now looking forward to reaching home after a good two hour's walk.

District Councillors' Update - January 2025

Age UK Hythe Lyminge & Ashford – I was as surprised as most people to learn of the closure of the Lyminge Centre. I have been in contact with Cleo Smith, the Chief Executive who advises that the Centre has not been able to cover its costs for some time and that with the reduction in KCC funding, the minimum wage and the proposed increased National Insurance Costs that running Lyminge is no longer sustainable. I understand that negotiations have also taken place with the



District Council who own the building and that while the rent increase could possibly be postponed, this would not materially change the situation. Cleo tells me that the Dementia unit will go to Hythe and that transport will be available to take those in most need to Hythe. Many residents have told me that they will very much miss the café and shop and I hope further consideration will be given to this situation.

Princes Parade Hythe – a short initial survey has just been published seeking views on the future use of this site, the survey is open until 5 pm on 16 February. The land had been earmarked for a swimming pool, leisure facilities and 150 houses, but this was rejected after the May 2023 district council elections. However, as the Council now has to prepare a new Local Plan and with increased housing targets set by Government, all options have to be considered.

Otterpool Park – discussions are on-going with Homes England and a six months collaboration arrangement, along with other papers, will be considered by the Cabinet on 11 December 2024 which, will, as usual, be webcast. The waste water treatment plant planning application is imminent and a public consultation was held at Sellindge recently.

Devolution – the White Paper on devolution was published in December 2024. KCC and FHDC are likely to disappear as separate organisations. I will report further on this next month and further details can be found at English Devolution White Paper - GOV.UK
Although writing this early in December, I hope you had a lovely Christmas and I wish you all a very Happy and Healthy New Year.

An important step has been taken to start the building of the Otterpool Park garden town and will be discussed by the F&HDC Councilliors at next week. The Council has worked with Homes England, the government housing and regeneration agency, to reach a Collaboration Agreement between them. The agreement, if accepted, would be for six months and will allow F&HDC to access the additional skills and expertise needed to attract investment and take the development forward. Prior to any building being started the wastewater treatment plant has to be constructed. I attended the public consultation on the Waste-Water Treatment Plant planning application. Lots of people, including Councillors, attended and there were Officers on hand to answers any questions. The consultation is ahead of the formal planning application which is likely to be submitted in January. Details can be found on www.otterpoolpark.org and comments can be submitted up to the 24th December.

The Chair of F&HDC, Cllr Anita Jones, has recently obtained tree whips from The Woodland Trust and around 600 trees were planted in Hythe recently. Other locations are set to benefit from new young trees soon. There are approximately 200 left and community groups and schools are being encouraged to get in touch with suggestions, contact chair@folkestone-hythe.gov.uk.

The consultation on the corporate plan has been completed, with 550 responses received, about a third of these were from younger members of the community. This is a really good response rate as these things go, so many thanks if you returned the online questionnaire.

In the New Year we're expecting to see the launch of a new programme of Green Community Grants, building on the success of the Rural England Prosperity Fund and the Green Business Grants. The grants will be available to community groups, town & parish councils, and local businesses, and intended to support a wide range of sustainability and carbon-reduction projects.

THE LYMINGE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN YOUR OPPORTUNITY TO SHAPE THE FUTURE OF OUR PARISH

Following our upbeat report in the December 2024 Newsletter we now have to advise Lyminge residents of a major setback.

As previously reported, at the full Lyminge Parish Council (LPC) meeting on 11th November 2024 the Council, following a presentation from the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group (NPSG), approved three motions suggested by councillors concerning

- 1. 'To allow residents to form a steering group to complete work on the Neighbourhood Plan
- 2. To agree to two or more councillors to be part of the steering group
- 3. To pass on the details of the consultant and any work already completed'

(Source - LPC Minutes agreed 09/12/24)

Each one was proposed, seconded and passed on the 11th November 2024.

At the subsequent full LPC meeting on 9th December 2024, although there was some disagreement as to their accuracy, the Minutes were agreed by a majority of councillors. There was no agenda item to allow any further discussion of this subject.

On 10th December at an informal meeting arranged at the Coach & Horses and attended by two councillors, the clerk and two members of the Steering Group, it emerged that the LPC would only allow, amongst other things, the Steering Group be known as a Working Party and that it would only be able to concern itself with Etchinghill matters. This is totally against the spirit behind the creation of the Steering Group which was to involve the whole Parish.

Furthermore, the Steering Group representatives were advised that the re-employment of the consultant would be undertaken by the LPC and the individual would only be allowed to consult/report directly to the clerk.

In addition, most of the existing files are allegedly subject to data protection rules and would likely only be released in a heavily redacted format.

The public meeting previously arranged and publicised by the NPSG (although now a Working Party) took place on 11th December 2024. After much discussion the public felt there was little to be gained by working with the LPC under the restrictions they had introduced (noting that there had been no subsequent motions to overturn those originally agreed at their meeting of 9th November) and that the degree of cooperation the LPC had previously expressed had no relationship to reality.

At the Coach & Horses meeting the Working Party representatives were told there were four to five other 'working groups' already actively working on the Plan within the Parish. However they could not be told who these groups were, who their members were and which part of the Plan they were working on. **The next full LPC committee meeting is Monday 13 January 2025** (the location is not yet posted on their website). If members of these groups could attend the LPC meeting and make themselves known to us then greater co-operation across the whole Parish could be achieved.

Considering all of these impediments, the public meeting concluded that no further work by the NPSG/Working Party could realistically be undertaken until the LPC had resolved its differences with the consultant, with a strong endorsement that the previous incumbent, Alison Eardley, be re-employed to work with all the groups!

Age UK Hythe, Lyminge and Ashford: Relocation of Services, Closure of the Lyminge Building and Future Plans

We at Age UK Hythe, Lyminge and Ashford wish to address the relocation of services and closure of the Lyminge building, a decision that has understandably caused concern. We hope to clarify why this step was necessary and outline our plans to continue supporting the Lyminge community.

Why the Lyminge Building is Closing

The closure of the Lyminge building was a difficult but essential decision driven by financial challenges. Like many charities, we are facing reduced government funding and a lack of external funding for specific services, such as Dementia and Wellbeing. Despite efforts to encourage greater use of the building, its operational costs, encompassing rent, maintenance, safety checks, repairs, insurance etc, have far exceeded the income generated by the activities, charity shop, and café.

Continuing to maintain the building would risk the long-term sustainability of our services across Hythe, Lyminge, and Ashford. By reallocating resources, we can focus on delivering vital support to more people in need.

Changes to Services

- **Dementia Day Break Service:** This vital service will relocate to our Hythe hub, where we can increase capacity and support a larger number of people living with dementia and their carers.
- Laundry Service: The Laundry Service ceased after the final delivery during the week commencing 16th December. Due to low demand and the unsustainable cost of maintaining the service without imposing unaffordable price increases, it was no longer viable. Clients have been informed, and details of other local service providers have been passed on to ensure they can access alternative services in the area.
- Charity Shop and Café: These facilities, while valued by members of the community, fall outside our core charitable objectives. Despite their contributions, the income generated is not enough to cover the costs associated with maintaining the building.

Supporting the Lyminge Community

Our commitment to Lyminge remains steadfast, and we are taking steps to ensure continued support:

- Outreach Programmes: We are exploring partnerships with local venues to host activities and services in the village, maintaining opportunities for social interaction and wellbeing.
- **Transport Solutions:** We are considering subsidised travel and volunteer-led transport schemes to help residents access services in Hythe and Ashford.
- Core Services: Key programmes like Meals on Wheels, Home Support, and specialised dementia services and support for carers will continue to serve the Lyminge area.

Staff Impact

One role, out of six, has resulted in redundancy. This individual holds a primary job outside of Age UK, and we are offering support during this transition. All other staff members are transitioning and will move to Hythe to ensure consistency and the continued level of care.

Financial Transparency

We want to reassure the community that our finances are independently audited annually to ensure transparency. Operational decisions are informed by monthly internal financial reviews, and our accounts reflect the financial realities of the entire organisation.

Building a Sustainable Future

Relocating services is not a decision we made lightly, but it is necessary to safeguard the long-term sustainability of our organisation and the services we provide. Consolidating operations at Hythe will allow us to expand critical services like dementia support while reducing overhead costs.

The closure of the Lyminge building marks the end of a chapter but not our commitment to the community. Thoughtful Food have resolved this year to focus on waste. Not only will we be giving you easy to follow tips on how to use every bit of your ingredients including the bits you normally throw away, we will also be asking you to think about the waste created by your food packaging. We will have some challenges starting in February highlighting just how much this is and ways it can be avoided. Are there any other ways we can avoid waste relating to the growing, buying and consumption of food? Could we embrace the philosophy of Permaculture that encourages people to work with nature, rather than against it to create sustainable ways of living. A small step would be to think more about shopping habits. Could you do fewer shopping trips, being more thoughtful about what you will need over the next couple of weeks? Many of you are already mindful of these matters but hopefully this year we can all make a pledge to make a difference to our impact on the world.

Jobs to do in the garden in January

Defining Ultra Processed Food (UPF) for your New Years Resolution

Whether it is a diet for weight loss, an attempt to eat less Ultra Processed Food or just to eat more healthily, cutting down on UPF has to be a good starting point and a definition helpful.

NOVA classification https://metabolichealth.com/the-nova-system-transforming-food-classification/ This system was developed by Carlos Monteiro and his Brazilian team. Instead of looking at food in terms of the nutritional content of protein, fat, fibre, carbohydrate, sugar, vitamins and salt, it categorizes the food according to how much it has been processed. There are 4 categories

1. Minimally processed: This includes foods that are fresh but have had inedible parts removed. They may be dried or frozen but have no added ingredients.

- Processed culinary ingredients: such as pressed oils, lard, cream, butter, ground and milled grains, honey and syrups.
- 3. Processed Food: canned, pickled vegetables, meat, fish or fruit, cheeses, artisan breads, salted meats, fermented foods, beer and cider. These foods may have added ingredients such as salt, sugar or yeast as part of the processing.
- 4. Ultra Processed Foods: Sugar sweetened drinks, packaged snacks, reconstituted meat, instant soups pre-prepared frozen dishes, ice cream. Formulations (not really food) made from a series of processes including extraction and chemical modification, includes very little intact group 1 foods.

Whole Roasted Cauliflower

I medium cauliflower, remove the outer leaves and stalk, but don't throw way. These will keep in the fridge for a few days to be used in soups, stir fries, ramens....

3 tbsp vegetable oil. 2tsp of dried mixed herbs, 2tsp sweet smoked paprika, 1 clove garlic, juice of half a lemon, 6 tbsp thick plain yogurt, small handful of parsley, pomegranate seeds

Place around 2 inches of water into a saucepan large enough to hold the cauliflower whole. Bring to the boil. Carefully lower the cauliflower into the water. Cook for 3 minutes. Carefully strain the water and allow the cauliflower to steam in the residue heat for 10 minutes. Pat dry with a cloth. Heat oven to 220/200°C (fan oven). Try and make use of your whole oven while it's on, this would be a good opportunity to bake some pies for the freezer. Combine the oil, herbs and garlic, paprika. Salt and pepper. Place the cauliflower in a deep roasting tin and pour/brush over the oil mixture. Roast in the oven for 20 minutes.

Mix together the lemon juice and yogurt with some salt and pepper. Baste the cauliflower with the oil and roast for another 20/25 minutes until crispy in places. Remove from oven, pour over the yogurt and sprinkle with the pomegranate seeds. Cut into wedges and serve. Serve with a refreshing winter slaw for a complete meal.

Winter Slaw

Try slicing or grating root vegetables to make a winter slaw. Swede, turnip and kohlrabi are delicious additions, as are any fresh sprouts you have lurking in the fridge from Christmas. Along with the usual, carrot, cabbage and onion, You could also add a grated eating apple. Sprinkle on some chopped roasted hazelnuts for flavour and texture. Make an orange or clementine dressing. Mix the juice of half an orange or a whole clementine with a drizzle of honey, 100ml of oil (your shout) 50ml of cider/ white wine vinegar.



IPBES¹ Nexus Report - We Need A Holistic Approach

The major environmental, social and economic crises facing the world today – involving biodiversity, climate change, health, food and water – are inextricably interlinked, and tackling them together has many benefits. Focusing on one issue alone, however, can make the other crises worse. That is the conclusion of the IPBES "Nexus Report" put together by 165 researchers from 57 countries over the past three years, and approved in December by the governments of 147 countries.

There is strong evidence that there are many actions that can be taken that

have beneficial effects in all five areas simultaneously - but there must be trade-offs: the actions with wideranging benefits aren't the same as the actions that are the most optimal solution to any one problem, hence the need for holistic decision-making. "The future scenarios with the widest nexus benefits are those with actions that focus on sustainable production and consumption in combination with conserving and restoring ecosystems, reducing pollution, and mitigating and adapting to climate change".

RSPB Big Garden Birdwatch 24-26 January

Big Garden Birdwatch is the world's largest garden wildlife survey. Spend an hour between 24-26 January 2025 and count the birds you see in your garden, from your balcony, or in your local park. Only count birds that land. Then tell the RSPB what you saw. Even if you see nothing, it still counts.

Every year, hundreds of thousands of nature lovers like you take part, helping to build a picture of how garden birds are faring. In 2024 over 600,000 people took part, counting a whopping 9.7 million birds! House Sparrows took the top spot, but counts of these chirpy birds are down by 60% compared to the first Birdwatch in 1979. In fact, we've lost 38 million birds from UK skies in the last 60 years. With birds facing so many challenges, it's more important than ever to get



involved in the Birdwatch. Every bird you do – or don't – count will give us a valuable insight into how garden birds are faring. See www.rspb.org.uk/birdwatch

"Providing natural food for garden birds is a vital and rewarding experience", according to the current RSPB magazine. "Supply a wealth of options as well as places where invertebrate life can thrive." Garden plants that provide "super seeds" include sunflowers, teasel, common knapweed, cornflower and corn marigold, while bountiful berries and fruits grow on hawthorn, guelder rose, crab apple, rowan, and of course ivy. Ivy is one of the best plants you can grow for wildlife. First the flowers appear late in the year, then the deep purpley-black berries which are richer in fat than most other berries. The berries also ripen later and over a longer period of time, ensuring a steady supply of vital nutrition. Ivy also provides cover for the birds themselves but also for invertebrates that are rich pickings for robins and wrens.



RSPB: Let's Make Bird-Feeding Safer

If you use bird-feeders, here's some more advice from the RSPB magazine: "Some birds benefit from us putting out extra food for them - however there is increasing evidence that for other birds there can also be negative effects such as the spread of disease. We want to make bird feeding as safe as possible - If you love feeding birds in your garden the best thing you can do this winter is **make sure you clean your feeders at least weekly."**







LYMINGE THEN AND NOW

Our monthly look at how Lyminge has changed over the years, with thanks to Lyminge Historical Society.





The pair of houses we look at this month stand on the south side of the High Street. They were built at the very beginning of the 20th Century. The site used to be part of Church Meadow, a field that was accessed from the lane that still exists running along the north boundary of the churchyard and which extended over most of the hillside running down to the High Street and along to Court Lodge Green by the Village Hall. The land was owned by the Rector of Lyminge for many years and was eventually inherited by William Jenkins, son of Canon Jenkins who died in 1896. William did not live in Lyminge and he divided the field up into development sites, selling this particular plot in 1900 to William Hills, who built the Church Stores. The building was initially known as Mafeking House, commemorating the famous 217 day siege during the war in South Africa that was relieved in May 1900 to national celebration.

The business was operated as two separate shops, one a grocer and general store and the other a draper. By 1918, this had been taken over by William Bryant and his wife Louisa, who continued to run it in much the same way during the inter-war period. But by the start of the Second World War, the property was unoccupied.

More recently, many residents will remember the house on the left of the picture as Lyminge Fish Bar, which did a good trade in both fish and chips and Chinese take-away food. But like so many of the small retail businesses in Lyminge, this eventually closed and like its neighbour, was converted into a residential property. The front of both houses has been rebuilt at ground level so it is now difficult to tell that either was once a shop.
