Margaret Saunders' Meanderings

It is a bright and raw morning and one of February's frosty starts. After so many dull misty days it is a pleasure to be out in the morning sunshine. I am once more at the Hythe Military Canal, starting from the same point as last month's walk, but walking in the opposite direction, towards Folkestone.

After passing some allotments, I cross the road by the RHDR station and walk alongside the water rather than taking the normal path. As the easterly wind is bitter, I choose to start my walk on the south side of the canal so that I might gather a little warmth from the sun. Pausing for a few moments on a bench I watch the rippling reflection of the reeds whilst listening to birdsong all around. Traffic noise is audible but not intrusive, allowing their songs to be heard clearly. A pair of moorhens is swimming near the opposite bank, upending as they feed on vegetation underwater. Floating on the surface three small yellow leaves bob about on the undulating

ripples, making negligible progress as the canal water does not flow like a stream. Two mallards, male and female, dabble by ducking into the water to feed, their pale rear ends rising vertically into the air.

A milepost, in the shape of an upturned fish tail, tells me I am twenty four miles from Rye and six miles from Folkestone. Painted deep blue and decorated with marine shapes in gold, this milepost is one of a thousand

'Millennium Mileposts' erected by the National Cycle Network to mark its creation and was funded by the Royal Bank of Scotland. It is Cycle Route 2 which runs from Dover to St Austell, along the south coast.

The Royal Military Canal was built under the supervision of the Royal Staff Corps and was operated by Soldiers of the Royal Waggon Train. The latter was disbanded in 1832 when it was absorbed into the Royal Army Service Corps. Archaeological evidence shows that the original bridges across the canal were swing bridges. Much of its entire length is designated as a Local Wildlife Site and weed barges regularly cut the reeds and water lilies to maintain a channel for boats and fishermen. Towards the end of the section that runs alongside Portland Road, stone and then cement have been used to stabilize the canal bank, continuing all the way to Twiss Road. In the Summer months between Easter and October, rowing boats can be hired and an electric boat runs a cruise westwards along the canal.



Crossing Stade Street I continue along the north side as this is now in the sun. Seagulls bask on the bank preening and resting while many ducks peck in the grass or swim in pairs on the water, the female always leading the male (or even two!) indicating the mating season is around the corner. Pied wagtails wag their tails up and down on the opposite bank searching for insects and seeds. I take the bridge by the white War Memorial and continue along the south bank. Buffeted by the wind, a small white feather spirals, pirouetting its way along like a ballerina, light enough and mostly proud of the surface to become mobile. Two crows peck in the grass, their glossy black plumage shining in the sunlight. On reaching Twiss Road I cross the bridge and turn back westwards along the north side, stopping off at Waitrose for a warming cup of tea, as my fingers are now numb and I'm finding it difficult to write my notes.

Once warm again with the sun on my left, I spot snowdrops and crocuses around the base of a tree. High up, spherical seeds hang from a plane tree and straight golden twigs push skywards from willow trees. A memorial to the



civilian navvies who dug the canal, one holding a pickaxe and the other a shovel, sits alongside the path. Soldiers built the ramparts. It took four and a half years to build and after the threat of invasion had passed, it was used in an effort to control smuggling on Romney Marsh, with limited success. During the Second World War the canal was manned by the 31st Independent Brigade Group, who fortified each salient with barbed wire entanglements and a concrete pillbox, many of the latter still survive today.

Walking close to the water once again, I notice some butterbur plants, their pretty pink flowers almost lost amongst their bright green foliage. In the days before fridges, butter was wrapped in the leaves of this plant in an effort to keep it cool and clean. As an early flowering plant, they provide pollen and nectar for bees and insects when little else is available.

From its defensive military beginnings to the current status of Local Wildlife Site, the canal is now a great asset to the local area and one to be enjoyed at any time of year.

We try to feed the dogs a specific diet to maintain their health so it doesn't help when they come out of the tree line with sliced bread or packets of meat. I'm not sure that the wildlife need feeding anyway as there is a plentiful supply of rabbits and pigeons for the foxes etc. Stephen Harrison



District Councillors' Update - March 2025

FHDC have been informed that KCC is not on the priority list for devolution, meaning that the KCC Elections on 1st May will be going ahead as originally planned.

The Officers at FHDC have said there is a lot of work to do before they can consider what happens with the AgeUK building in Lyminge and a final decision is yet to be made. However, to continue to make use of the building as a community facility it would need to be kept maintained and serviced and the council does not have the resources to do this.



Disappointingly, there were two incidents of surface water discharge into the Nailbourne recently. On both occasions the separate incidents were reported to Southern Water, they attended, and resolved the problems. I alerted Southern Water via their Engagement Manager for Kent. Thankfully, the blockages were cleared.

Agreeing the final collaboration agreement for the Otterpool Park development is moving into a final stage. Interviews have been carried out for the post of Home England's project manager in order for them to report on progress.

FHDC is to launch a Green Grants scheme later this month. The money will be available over the next two years and is targeted at groups whose aim is to increase climate resilience and reduce carbon footprints. This will be available across the district and applications will be invited from parishes, community groups and other organisations. It can be used for anything from rewilding and tree planting to parish premises improvements.

Devolution and Local Government Reorganisation - In view of the Government Reorganisation Programme with Kent County Council, Medway Council and the Districts and Boroughs likely to disappear over the next few years, I put forward a motion to full Council on 29 January to ask the Secretary of State for permission to remain as a Cabinet/Leader style of Governance. This is to allow resources, Officer and staff time and funding to be focused on ensuring our residents get the best deal possible moving forward. The motion was passed by 16 votes to 13.

It is extremely disappointing that Kent is not in the priority programme as some funding was promised. However, Kent and Medway are still expected, to put forward a proposal by the 21 March on how many Unitary Councils Kent and Medway should have with a full programme of implementation by the autumn. At the moment three or four Unitary councils are being considered; three I think would be sensible in East Kent, West Kent and North Kent. Dividing the County into four is more difficult. In the meantime Kent County Council elections will take place on 1 May.

Kent & Medway Police & Crime Panel – I attended the Budget Police & Crime Panel on 4 February. In order to balance the budget, there is a need to make savings of £10m – for details Agenda for Kent and Medway Police and Crime Panel on Tuesday, 4th February, 2025, 10.00 am In the circumstances, it was unanimously agreed to an increase in the precept to £14 per year for a Band D Property. Meetings are held quarterly and I can put one question to the Commissioner on policy (not operations), the next meeting is in June.

Scrutiny Programme – 2025-2026 - Residents have the opportunity to shape the programme of the council's overview and scrutiny committee. Ideas do not have to be limited to the council or its services – but cannot include planning applications, licensing matters, housing appeals or disciplinary issues. Recently, I was being driven by my sister-in-law (Trish) to a medical appointment in Rochester. My nephew (Dan) was also with us.

Having made good progress until the top of Bluebell Hill, the car suddenly developed threatening noises, lurching forward, slowing down and screaming until it ground to a full halt in the town centre, It was Saturday afternoon when parking was restricted here.





This year we have promised to give ideas on how to cut down on waste from utilizing more food stuffs in the kitchen, collecting seeds to sustainably grow vegetables to the general principles of permaculture.

What is Permaculture?

Permaculture is an ethics-based approach to designing systems for all aspects of life, inspired by and working with nature. Following this approach helps us to tread lightly on the Earth, without degrading the environment we need to survive. It all sounds a bit mysterious, but it's actually very simple, intuitive and in many ways 'common sense'. The world can feel like a tough place to be, from pandemics, to social isolation, to costof-living crisis and climate breakdown. Permaculture holds many keys to a different way forward that offers more hope. We'll cover different aspects of permaculture over the next few newsletters, to give you an introduction.

Permaculture's Ethics

There are three key ethics that underpin all permaculture approaches...

- Earth Care Simply put, our approaches should have taking care of the Earth in mind, and living within its means. Permaculture solutions are often regenerative in nature, actually improving our environment, whilst providing what we need.
- People Care This focuses on the well-being of individuals and communities, ensuring that solutions provide access to what people need.



• Future Care - This is also sometimes called 'Fair Share' and is about living within our means and resources, to create sustainable human habitation of the Earth, preserving it for those who come after us.

Next month we will begin highlighting different permaculture principles, and how you can use them in practice

Things to do in the garden in March

Spring is on its way so you can start sowing seeds directly outdoors for cool-weather crops like carrots, spinach, beetroot, salad leaves, spring onions, radishes, broad beans, and peas. It is worth investing in a soil thermometer, they are not expensive and will prove a great investment. Test | the temperature of the soil and hang back from planting your seeds until it reaches around 10°C, but at least 7°C. Prepare the soil by adding compost, start sowing seeds indoors for more tender plants like tomatoes and peppers.

Key tasks for March vegetable garden: Direct sow outdoors: carrots, spinach, beetroot, salad leaves, spring onions, radishes, broad beans, peas

Thai Curry Noodle Soup

This is a great dinner made up from those bits and bobs of veg you have in the fridge that need using up, anything will do, broccoli stalks, cauliflower leaves, those two dog end of carrots you can't bear to throw away.......

- 1 tsp vegetable oil
- 1 heaped tbsp Thai green curry paste
- 220g stir-fry vegetable mix
- 180ml light coconut milk
- 220ml vegetable stock made with 1 low-salt stock cube 1 spring onion sliced, to serve
- 250g straight-to-wok udon noodles
- 5g coriander roughly chopped
- 5g Thai basil roughly torn
- Red chilli sliced, to serve (optional)

Method

Step 1 Heat the oil in a saucepan over a medium heat and cook the curry paste for 1 min before adding the stir-fry veg and prawns. Cook for 3 mins until the prawns are mostly pink, then add the coconut milk, veg stock and noodles.

Step 2 Bring to the boil, then reduce the heat to a simmer and cook for 5 mins until the noodles are cooked through and the veg is tender but still has a bite. Divide between two bowls and sprinkle over the herbs, chilli and spring onion.

Tree Planting in the Parish



This week saw Sibton Park Cricket Club taking up the challenge of planting hedging and trees around its pitch. This is the start of a larger piece of flood mitigation work that will be taking place this coming winter in partnership with Southeast Rivers Trust, Affinity Water, Holiday Property Board and Natural England.

Sibton Park Cricket Club have been working to understand the flow of underground water in the area that sometimes appears on the pitch in the Winter and early Spring. They hope to reduce the amount of water that comes to the surface by increasing the amount of water sapping roots around the ground (obviously being sensitive to the pitch itself) and increase the biodiversity in the area.





LYMINGE THEN AND NOW

Our monthly look at how Lyminge has changed over the years, with thanks to Lyminge Historical Society.





Readers last month may recall that the view of the crossroads between Church Road and the High Street, showed Old Forge Cottage, on the corner opposite the Coach and Horses. It was newly built in the years after the Second World War, and at that time there was very little tree cover. As you can see from the picture on the right, this house today is shrouded by trees.

The view this month shows the crossroads from Well Road, with the Coach and Horses on the right-hand side, and the site of the Old Forge to the left. The photo on the left probably dates from between 1900 and 1920 when Forge Cottages occupied the corner of the crossroads. The forge was to the left of this building, just visible at the edge of the picture. In 1840, the smith Edward Hogben lived in this cottage with his wife Esther and seven children. By 1911, the smith was Walter, Edward's grandson, who lived in part of the cottages with his wife Rosetta and five children, while 73 year old widower John Black occupied the end cottage with his housekeeper.

The current pub building dates to 1888, although as we saw in last December's *Lyminge Then and Now*, this was built on the site of a much older pub of the same name. The pub was owned by Faversham-based brewer Rigden's. The picture on the left seems to predate the merger of the business with that of George Beer & Co of Canterbury in 1922 when the brewery became George Beer and Rigden Ltd. Thomas Tritton moved from another Rigden's pub, The Rising Sun on Sturry Road, Canterbury, to become licensee in 1903. After he died in 1905, his widow Elizabeth took over the licence, but she moved away during the First World War. Frederick Hopton, previously at another Rigden's pub, The Chequers in Ash, then took over. He died in 1925, but his widow Emma continued the business. By the time of the Second World War, she was no longer the licensee, but she was still living at the pub in 1961 when she died at the age of 86.
