Margaret Saunders' Meanderings

On the warmest day of the year so far I undertake my third Hythe Canal walk, from Twiss Road eastwards to Seabrook, where the canal begins (or ends). Choosing to take the path on the south side, to benefit from the warmth of the sunshine but to avoid the light in my eyes, I set off on what is a new walk for me. On this side, the bank is lower than on the opposite side and so I am able to walk close to the water's edge. As the air is relatively still, there is a mere shiver of movement on the surface of the water and a slight mistiness in the air, despite the strong sunlight.

The canal cost £234,310 to construct in 1806, which equalled the cost of four of the largest warships of the time. It was originally 18 metres wide and 3 metres deep and had a towing path for the horses that pulled the barges for military and civilian transport. The canal did not in fact ever see active service although it did



form part of Britain's defences in WWII when a line of pillboxes was built along its length. I pass the remains of one of these pentagonal concrete structures on the north bank. Three iron bridges, freshly painted turquoise and of varying designs, cross the canal along my route. During war, these bridges were either removed or prepared for demolition, as mentioned in Colonel Rodney Foster's book, "The Real 'Dad's Army': The War Diaries

of Col. Rodney Foster". He lived in Hythe throughout the war and kept a daily diary of entries about the local weather, his pets and war events, the bombings of Dover and Folkestone, including the Battle of Britain.

In the background as I start my walk I can hear the crack of rifle fire from the ranges and the screech of a military jet as it passes parallel to the coast out to sea. Coming only days after the White House 'spat' it is a stark reminder of how fragile peace can be.

Finding solace in nature is well known, so I turn my thoughts and eyes to my surroundings. Tree roots make the path uneven; elder catkins dangle next to bunches of small cones; brambles burst into bud along their viciously thorned stalks; an old fallen tree has shed a tangle of ivy stems, creating a new habitat amongst its twisted and dried remains; spiked glossy leaves shine on perfect cone-shaped holly trees; striking patterns on the bark of a tree; a goldfinch flies across the path, perching in amongst the brambles – it's beautiful colouring of red and yellow made them popular cage birds in Victorian times. Every few

yards a short patch of cleared ground leads to the water's edge. At water level on the opposite side a slight break in the reeds is covered by an overhanging tree creating an 'alcove', providing a safe haven for wildlife. South-westerly prevailing winds have pushed the feathery fronds of the reeds so that the more delicate bristle ends face away towards the north-east and today their soft brown spikelets catch the sun and sway slightly in the breeze.

Willow trees spurt new orangey-yellow twigs which shoot straight up like thin jets of flame. A flash of turquoise streaks past me over the water: a kingfisher on a mission! Too fast for a photo, but always good to see. Standing

on a bridge and looking westwards into the sun, the haze gives the scene a painterly look, calm and still with the muted colours of approaching Spring. Moving on, I look back at the bridge, fascinated by the rippling reflection of the railings which has turned the straight lines of the uprights into gently weaving

zig-zags. This is the last of the three bridges which span the canal on this walk before I reach the end at Seabrook, where I begin



my return journey westwards on the north bank. This side of the canal is nearer the main road and houses, giving it a more urban feel. Sparrows have gathered in a dense hedge and are chattering non-stop; a blackthorn tree is in full blossom; daisies abound in a patch of grass; ivy, the berries stripped leaving bare stalks sticking into the air; robin song accompanies me as I walk; blackbirds search for worms along the wet patches of mud on the path. Looking along the length of the canal, haze hovers in the air, softening the view.



Something underwater causes a ring of ripples to start from the centre. As the ripples widen, eventually reaching each bank, they become more gentle before finally fading from view. Then, all is still once more.

So, what was once a construction to counter invasion in a time of war, now provides a peaceful haven for both wildlife and humans.




District Councillors' Update - April 2025

I want to take this opportunity to wish you all a very peaceful and Happy Easter.

F&HDC have launched its Green Grants scheme. Application forms and details of how to apply can be found on the Folkestone Works website. From 6pm on the 1st April there will be an in-person forum held at The Workshop in Tontine Street to help and assist with applications.

The District verge mowing contract has been handed back to KCC. We are told the verges will be cut twice between 1 March and 31 October. Any enquiries regarding





A public meeting was held explaining the implications of Local Government Reorganisation. The initial submission has been sent to the Government, the final submission is due in November. The Public meeting was recorded and is available on the council website for you to view.

Age UK will be handing back the Jubilee building to F&HDC at the end of March. F&HDC have appointed City Guardians to provide security to prevent squatting and theft from the building. City Guardians work by letting out rooms on a rolling monthly contract so the council can get the property back at very short notice. Guardians have to be over 18 years old and are vetted by City Guardians before they are registered to rent rooms from any properties.

Unfortunately, the average council tax is to be increased by 2.99%. Town and parish precepts form part of the council tax requirement.

Budget 2025/26 The current Administration agreed the budget for 2025/2026 on 26 February 2025. This budget increases Council Tax by 2.99% - an increase of £8.85 on a Band D Property. Fees and charges were also increased. My group abstained from voting because we are concerned by the decrease in assets of £17.2m due to the land held for the Princes Parade Project being revalued as amenity land instead of residential development land. We also asked a question on provision of leisure facilities within the District (including a swimming pool) as there is no immediate funding shown in the budget. There is an additional expense regarding the increased Employers' National Insurance contributions of about £250,000 as the Government promised re-imbursement only covered half the cost and this is only for this year!

Age UK Hythe Lyminge & Ashford Along with other District Councillors', I received the proposed plan for The Lyminge Community Hub at Everist Court. I had a discussion with the Director of Housing and Operations who said that the Leader of the Council was considering the proposal and would be responding in due course.

Call for sites FHDC re-opens the call for sites on 13 March and will run for 6 weeks closing at 5 pm on 24 April. The Council are seeking land for several uses, the main one being housing (including plots for Gypsy and Travellers and self-build) but also for employment and community uses. For further information, please see the FHDC website.

Local Government Re-organisation The Government has asked for interim plans on Local Government Re-organisation by 21 March. This involves the creation of a one tier system across Kent. By the time you read this, proposals for the number of unitary Councils for Kent and Medway will have been submitted to Government. There are likely to be four Models submitted.

Model 1 is a three unitary model which has FHDC with Ashford, Dover, Thanet and Canterbury

Model 2 is a four unitary model which has FHDC with Dover and Ashford

Model 3 is a four unitary model which has FHDC with Ashford & Swale

Model 4 is a four unitary model which has FHDC with Thanet and Dover

FHDC have agreed to do some analysis on the models with a view to assessing which is the best model for the District. This is additional work for Officers and is likely to increase the Council's cost.

Government has promised feedback on the initial proposals to the District Leaders and it is expected that a full detailed proposal will need to be submitted by 28 November 2025. However, if there is no overall agreement by District Leaders, the Government could impose a model on us!

The view of my group is to go for Model 1, merging with Ashford, Dover, Thanet and Canterbury. Although this seems very large scale it is very much in keeping with the Government criteria in that a Unitary should have a minimum of 500,000 (Model 1 would be about 650,000) population. Other models have at least one unitary less than the 500,000 population. However, watch this space!



The pitch is maintained for cricket games and is not a designated right of way. Walking dogs on it can cause damage to the surface and in the past, we have had several, not so considerate people leave unpleasant presents for us to find, which was why the signs were put up several years ago with the support from The Holiday Property Bond.

We do in fact welcome many visitors and their dogs to our club during the season but ask them to adhere to the Countryside Code whilst out enjoying our beautiful local countryside by ensuring they stick to the vast number of designated rights of way and to clean up after their dogs.

Getting to know Permaculture

Following on from our *Introduction to Permaculture* last month, we're going to begin to explore some of the key permaculture principles, that show how to apply these approaches in our everyday lives...

Principle: Observe and Interact

This is a great starting point for applying permaculture approaches that will be successful. In our fast-paced world, there is often a temptation to steam ahead and get things done quickly. Sometimes this works fine. But sometimes that failure to take time to observe surroundings, situations and people, means an issue is misdiagnosed and the solution chosen is inappropriate. In taking a pause to observe and interact, we can learn a great deal of valuable information to inform our decisions.

In action

After moving to a new house, the homeowner ponders what to do with their new outdoor space, and would like a bench at the end of the garden. However, after observing the garden for a year before acting, it's clear the end of the garden is often very wet, making it a better spot for a wet-loving tree like a willow instead.



Things to do in the garden in April

Vegetable growing really takes off this month. Plant out those chitted second and early potatoes in the first half of the month and maincrop potatoes in the second half. It's also time to sow seed outdoors in well prepared soil.

Sow seed outdoors for beetroot, carrots, Swiss chard, summer cauliflower, kohl rabi, lettuce, leeks, radish, turnip, spring and pickling onions, peas and perpetual spinach in well-prepared soil.

Sow seed indoors of marrows, courgettes, pumpkins and squash. Also sweet peppers, tomatoes, cucumbers, aubergines, celery, celeriac, salads and globe artichoke

Fermented foods are good for our gut health and overall wellbeing. There are now many fermented foods like Kafir and Kambucha. Suspicions are raised over the over-processing of these and their plastic packaging.

Kafir

Kafir is a fermented milk drink which is very easy to make. It can be made with water if you have a diary intolerance. The recommended daily intake is at least 120ml of Kafir. Many of the supermarket varieties are only 65ml and contain sugar and various fruit flavourings. You would need to drink at least 2 a day which would be quite expensive and involve 2 plastic containers.

General rules for making Kafir

You will need to buy some Kefir culture.

These sites will give you instructions on how to start your culture and probably try to sell you lots of kit but you just need two glass/plastic jars, one for fermenting and one for collecting your kefir drink, a plastic sieve, a glass bowl for sieving, a wooden spoon and a tea cloth to keep your fermenting jar in the dark. Kefir MUST not come into contact with metal.

Kefir culture can last indefinitely, if however you are going away it's best to keep it in the fridge.

If you find the taste a bit challenging you could always add some honey and fruit but after a while you may find you actually enjoy the bitterness! Good luck.




More Hedge/Tree Planting in the Parish



LYMINGE THEN AND NOW

Our monthly look at how Lyminge has changed over the years, with thanks to Lyminge Historical Society.





This month we look at the old village police station, which stands on the corner of Church Road and Canterbury Road, facing Lindon Hall. The picture on the left was taken around 1988, by which time it had acquired the name Burga House.

The main house was originally built in the 1960s as a home for a policeman. The single-storey flat-roofed extension to the right was the village police station at this time. The three-pane window was inserted later to block the original entrance doorway to the police station. There are lots of these police houses still to be found in Kent, built at a time when Kent Constabulary aimed to provide a dense coverage of policing with a local 'bobbie' in many villages. There are two similar houses on the edge of Elham on the main road as you approach from Lyminge. They were sold off to become private housing during the 1980s. A curious legacy that devolved on to the new private householder was to monitor the receiver that was left in place to warn of a Russian nuclear missile attack. A test signal was sent every six months to make sure the village could still receive warning of an attack, and it was necessary for the occupier to confirm that the signal had been received successfully. No instructions were provided on what to do in the event of a real Russian attack, and what would have happened if this had been during the working day when no one was at home is difficult to say.

A scheme of extension executed around 2021/22 has changed Burga House considerably from how it once appeared. The house still stands more or less on its original footprint, but the works involved demolishing the single storey utility room to the left and the old police station to the right. New two-storey extensions to either side have expanded the accommodation and the timber cladding installed to the face of the upper floor now completely obscures the building's original identity and function.

Update from the Lyminge Community Hub..

The company name has been registered with Companies House and by the time you read this we are formally the **Lyminge Community Hub C.I.C.** which is a Community Interest Company (i.e. not-for-profit).

We have registered the web site - Lyminge Community Hub.Org - and would really, really welcome a volunteer(s) to set it up very simply & properly!

Written presentations have been made to all the key councillors at F&HDC & our MP and conversations are ongoing. We are creating the consultation that should have taken place about the closure of the Age UK facility.

One question that has been raised is - 'What is a Community Hub?'

It is a modern version of a meeting place for the community that follows from, in historical terms, the origins of village market squares. It is a dedicated space to facilitate communal progress. Importantly the hub will provide facilities which are not otherwise available in the village – that statement is at the core of the hub's purpose.

It is not a sports centre, nor is it theatre or a meeting hall. It is an environment, supported by local opportunities. In the case of Lyminge it is proposed, to begin with a café, a bring and buy repair hub for small electrical goods and other devices as all part of an environmental sustainability policy and a pre-loved or charity shop. There are many other opportunities from a daily farmers market stall to weekly banking hubs. All ideas welcome.

Key to all this is that it is a "not for profit" organisation run by volunteering members for the community for everybody from octogenarians to preschoolers.
